- A police school liaison has been reinstated this year (after a few years without the budget to support this department)
- School Liaison Department is a team of 5, and serves 10 schools in our community
- Primary mandate to support families & kids, and add humanity to the face of our local police department
- Wish to remain informed of events happening where liaison can attend, especially if it has to do with food as Mr. C has a restaurant background

# **Administration Updates**

# Miss Tricia - Hot Lunch Program Update:

- Program name has changed to Nutritional Snack Program
- Program will include a hot lunch every day all year
- Change: there will be no beverages provided this year

- Truffles has signed on for a one year contract as caterer.
- 137 students are enrolled so far (150 were enrolled by this point last year)
- Price has technically gone down per child, per day

## **Principal/Vice-Principal Report:**

- Toast Program will be running every morning this year; Mrs. Schubert runs this program with much help from staff and community volunteers; substantial funding for this program is provided by Breakfast & Music
- Verification forms have gone out to all students; important especially for CURRENT and CORRECT contact information (phone numbers, email, and addresses)
- Clubs starting soon: Soccer, Track, Swim, and Choir
- Community programs (PISE etc.) are starting soon; Dianne has been to almost all classrooms to let students know what is happening, and distributing sign up forms
- Coordinator for Victoria Symphony has chosen us as a school of choice for their support; Grade 2's & 4's will have opportunity to go to the symphony in the spring; different musical events to be presented at the school
- Indigo Grant continues to be spent on books!
- Nov 13th has been confirmed as PAC Meeting
- 413 students are enrolled this year; staff and district decided against adding a division but were approved for funding for extra teacher; total of 20 divisions this year
- September 2019 will be the last year that students go straight into their new classes; next year will be new system, based on either going back into previous class, or grade groupings while class creation happens within that first week of school.
- Staffing update
- Facilities:
  - New fire alarms installed; first fire drill September 20th
  - Library renos/remediation may start in October
  - Construction has started on Albina for infrastructure for the 2 new childcare portables being added
  - Request has been made by Jeff for sound-proofing in our gym
  - Gym will be getting a partitioning curtain
- Jeff thanked custodial team for arranging a full team to come in and fully clean the whole school over the summer, and doing an excellent job
- Questions answered about Lunch Buddies
- Lockdown Drill, with Saanich Police Dept, is on November 26th

# **Treasurer report - Mira MacIver**

- Mira is our new treasurer this year and is getting familiar with the big task of managing the PAC's budget

- \$4872 in Savings
- \$16,000 in Checking
- \$4500 in Gaming fund expecting \$7500 approximately in October

  - 50/50 requires a lot more tickets to be sold
  - Travis to follow up with coordinator to find out dates available for tickets, and possibly negotiate a lower number of tickets for a Chuck-a-Puck event.
- 4. Christmas Market Mandy Greyling Holmwood
  - November 16th
  - fundraises with bake sale, and raffle primarily
  - requested volunteers to help out
  - around 15 applicants already in
  - Mandy to get banner, new stickers for dates, and get banner up around/before Halloween
- 5. Gift Sale Deb Azouri
  - All day sale this year, during school hours
  - suggestion to add sibling age on list of gift recipients
  - suggestion to have premade labels for each child
- 6. Walk a Thon -
  - Proposed by previous executive as a way to mitigate projected budget deficit for 2019/2020; past walkathons have raised up to \$4000; suggested date to be in May for Rainbow Week; Rainbow theme

- Interactive Games Cafe brought in games; functioned as a community-building event, not a fund-raiser; was fun and successful, to be organized again for this year.
- 2. Popup Shop for Tillicum Gear Lisa Gelling
- Lisa has created an online popup shop to sell a selection of Tillicum gear (hat, water bottle, hoodies and shirts), at discounted prices; order online and shipped to the school for distribution; our PAC receives 10% of sales; 12 unit minimum order; Shop to open on Monday September 16th and close on September 30th.

- 3. Halloween Costume Swap Lisa Connell
- Suggestion to create a costume swap, either this year or maybe next year
- 4. Earthquake Supplies & Comfort Kits Lynea McDowell
- Each child in our school receives a ziplock baggie with instructions for parents to fill them with personal, comforting items, snacks, and a note; those 'Comfort Kits' are compiled for each classroom and put into a backpack and stored in the Emergency Kiosk outside; Charity, Carli and Mandy to help Lynea with kits this year
