Administration Updates Principal/Vice-Principal Report – Jeff Duyndam & Rhonda Leduc

- Emergency drills first drill was planned for Sept 21, but because of 4 unplanned firerelated drills already, there will be no drill. Monthly fire drills, 2 earthquake drills and a lockdown drill are required every school year.
- Earthquake drill on Tuesday October 18 with the Great Shakeout.
- Complaint Process Policy 115. Annual reminder there is a process followed for all complaints from the public
- Zoom is no longer supported by the school district so we're now on MS Teams for our meetings
- Thank you to the custodial staff who did a full scrub of the school over the summer
- Thank you to the office staff for prepping in late August for a smooth start to the school year.
- Custodial has been reduced by 50%. Justin (in for Paul) is in the school until 10:30 am. If there are custodial issues after 10:30 am teachers deal with it, or call Justin to come back. Gene comes in at 3:30 pm so there is a 5-hour gap in the day with no custodial.
- Staffing the .1 counsellor position as been filled. Mary, Frank & Kate make up the counselling team. Working on filling some EA positions. A few positions are being filled for part time or medical absences. Reggie Charlie is the new IEA
- Carpets are returning to K, 1 & 2 classrooms and will be vacuumed daily
- Field trips with buses, carpooling are allowed again
- Recognition will continue to happen in class
- Staff have been asked to submit budget requests to the PAC to Jeff & Rhonda and he will bring them forward
- School operating budgets (to buy general supplies) have been reduced by 50% this year and have also lost collaboration funds to send teachers to work with other teachers
- New fund from Provincial Government \$1.9 million to our district. The district sent out a survey to parents asking how they think it should be spent

TILLICUM ELEMENTARY PAC MEETING MINUTES **APPROVED** September 14, 2022 via Microsoft Teams

- The company that usually fills the Sequarium in the main foyer is having staffing issues, so Karen Fraser will look for an alternative this year. There is money allocated from the PAC budget.
- First Pro D day is September 23rd. Staff will be doing a drum workshop or assessment workshop
- Food In Schools Guidelines are currently in draft but the government says they will be implemented shortly. It essentially limits any food served or given on the school to whole grains, plain milk & yogurt, fruit and vegetables. There was some discussion about how this will affect Food for Fun or other family events and how this may be implemented or policed. While the guidelines are in draft form we can proceed, once they are implemented we will need to look at other options
- Crossing guard program some of the EAs are doing crossing guard duty at Burnside/Seaton and Tillicum/Arena for 45 minutes before and after school
- Swimming update the PAC funds swimming lessons for all grade 3 students. This year the plan was to offer lessons to the grade 4 & grade 5 kids who missed their grade 3 lessons. Esquimalt Pool is unable to provide all the lessons requested so only the grade 3 students will receive lessons this year
- Bike to Work/ School week is October 3 to 7. Posters etc. will be in the school and some outside
- Positive behaviour expectations at school have been reviewed in each class for the start of school. This was also discussed at the first assembly last week.
- Nutritional snack program there are about 12 students on the program. The current cost of the program is \$4 per student. Parents are asked to pay what they can afford as it is heavily subsidized
- Morning toast program is funded by grants is open 5 days a week and is serving about 110 students from 8:15 am to 8:45 am
- Terry Fox/ Cops for Cancer coin drive starts Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday next week
- Tour to Rock to visit Tillicum School October 6 probably in the morning
- Meet the teacher is on September 20. 4 :00 pm to 5:00 pm classrooms open, 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm pizza. Teachers have taken over this event this year thank you!
- Smallest cohort is grade 5 40 students. The rest of our cohorts are much bigger meaning we will be running out of space shortly. The music room may become a classroom and a second classroom will be configured in the school. The new portables in the front of the school must be used for childcare programs for 15 years before they can be used by the school.
- Question about parents/PAC being involved in the grade 5 transition process to Lansdowne as they are not many from the Tillicum cohort attend the school
